Read 1 Corinthians 7:32-35.

Paul is a big fan of being single. It works well for him considering his vocation as a traveling preacher/apostle. Honestly, the details he unpacks in this section of the letter is frustrating and a bit confusing. You almost feel like he thinks you are weak and not as spiritually faithful if you choose to marry. He never even mentions marrying for love. It seems like it all comes down to sex drive.
