How can being single or married increase your devotion to God?

Talk about the similarities between a commitment to marriage and a commitment to God.

Why do you think divorce among Christians and non-Christians is so common?

APPLY IT

Describe what it means to be committed and faithful to a husband or wife.

How would you describe your journey becoming committed and faithful to God?

PRAY
